Originally called "Bald Eagle", historic Lecompton is located about half way between Topeka and Lawrence. Three miles North of highway 40, Three miles South of highway 24, Or about five miles North West of the Lecompton Turnpike Interchange, Exit 197.

Lecompton is a vibrant sprawling rural community built along the river bluffs in North West Douglas County. The City limits include 224 homes for a total resident count of approximately 657 people within the 3.3 mile urban boundary. The remainder of Lecompton is agricultural farm and grazing land with small farms and homesteads patterning the horizon to the South and West.

As a charming and intimate small town, everyone knows everyone, and there is always a smiling face or passing wave. Lecompton residents possess a strong sense of community with a "help your neighbor" attitude, a place where you don't just reside in your community, you LIVE in it.

Being close to Lawrence and in Douglas County, one would expect to spend about the same amount per month on renting in Lecompton as they would in Lawrence. Housing prices tend to be a little cheaper than in the Lawrence community, but often time houses sell before even hitting the open market.

The school district is consolidated Perry – Lecompton USD#343 which includes children from unincorporated Big Springs, portions of Stull & Wakarusa Townships, Lecompton, Perry, Williamstown, Grantville, Newman, and townships around Perry Lake.

The fire district is part of the Consolidated Fire District #1 which includes participating Lecompton Fire/EMS, Wakarusa Township, Eudora Township, Kanwaka Township, and Clinton Township Fire departments and Clarion Springs EMS.

Currently we have 6 brick and mortar businesses located in our historic downtown including Bald Eagle Mercantile (flea market), Empty Nesters Winery, Aunt Netters Café, C&C Clothing/Claymama's art studio, New Image Beauty Salon & Bald Eagle Speed Shop (automotive shop). There are many other Home based businesses in the township.

The local post office is open Monday-Friday 8:30A-12PM and Saturday 8:30A-10A

Lecompton is definitely not a town with all the conveniences of larger cities – But a small town isn't defined by the number of people in it, or the number of square miles. It is about the connections we have with our neighbors and the investment each of us makes in our community for it to be a success. If community participation, hard work and a little place with some peace and quiet are what you are looking for, then Lecompton is the right place for you.
